

My Voting Plan

(Adapted from the SC Chapter, The Links)

1. Register to Vote & Verify Your SC Record by Oct 14th

___ I am registered to vote (new deadline due to the storm is October 14th)

___ I have verified that my SC voter record is valid and my registration address matches my state ID by going to www.scvotes.gov/voters and selecting "Check Your Voter Registration"

2. Choose how I will vote

___ I will vote in person during early voting time (Monday, Oct. 21 – Saturday, Nov. 2, 2024, Sunday excluded) 8:30 – 6:00

___ I will vote in person on Election Day (November 5, 2024) 7:00 – 7:00

___ I will vote by absentee ballot. (I requested my ballot on _____ & returned it on _____)

3. I will prepare to vote

___ I know my polling location (Note: Many locations have changed)

- If voting early, early voting locations are listed on the back of this sheet
- If voting on Election Day, I have verified my polling location as shown on back of this sheet

___ I have downloaded my ballot by going to www.scvotes.gov/voters and selecting "Get My Sample Ballot" so I will know where I vote and who and what is on my ballot--national, state, and local

___ I have researched my national, state, county and local candidates

___ I have researched any tax referendums and constitutional amendments on my ballot

4. I know how to get help or answers

___ If I have general questions about the voting process, I will go to www.scvotes.gov/voters

___ If I have problems at the polls, I can call for assistance at 866-OUR-VOTE (Election Protection) or 800-253-3931 to report what you to believe to be misinformation, voter intimidation or fraud.

5. I will encourage others to vote

___ I will help others prepare by sharing this information with at least five other people

___ I will check with my friends and family members to ensure that they vote

WHERE WILL I VOTE IF I VOTE ON ELECTION DAY?

If you vote on election day, you must vote at your assigned voting location, **many** which have changed. Go to www.scvotes.gov/voters; Select "Find My Polling Place" and complete the form to determine your location.

WHAT IDS CAN I USE?

Driver's license, DMV issued ID card (available free from the DMV), Photo Voter Registration Card, Federal military ID, or U.S. passport.

If you cannot get a photo ID due to a reason beyond your control, you may vote a provisional ballot after presenting a current, non-photo registration card and signing an affidavit provided by poll managers stating why you could not obtain the photo ID. Your ballot will count unless your reason is challenged and denied.

WHAT IS THE PROPOSED CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENT CHANGE?

The current state constitution says that **every** citizen of the United States and of this State of the age of eighteen and upwards is entitled to vote.

The proposed change is to change the word **every** to **only**, saying that **only a** citizen of the United States....A no vote means to keep the constitution as is. A **yes** vote means to change it. No explanation has been provided as to why the change nor how the wording changes the constitution's meaning.

IMPORTANT THINGS TO REMEMBER

If you are already in the line by the 7 pm closing time, you are supposed to still be allowed to vote.

Some offices such as school boards are non-partisan so make sure if you vote a straight party ticket, you remember to also vote for the non-partisan positions on your ballot.
